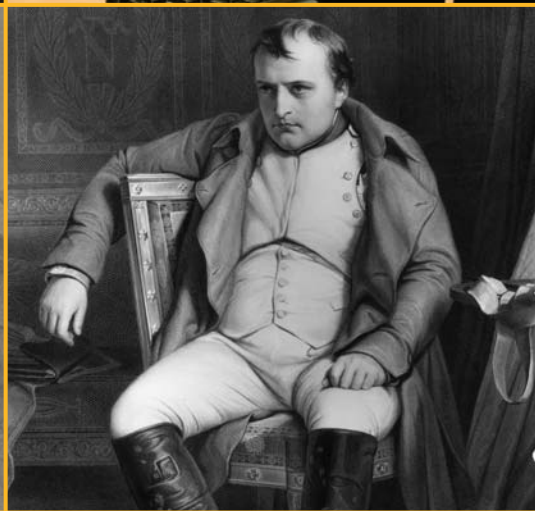
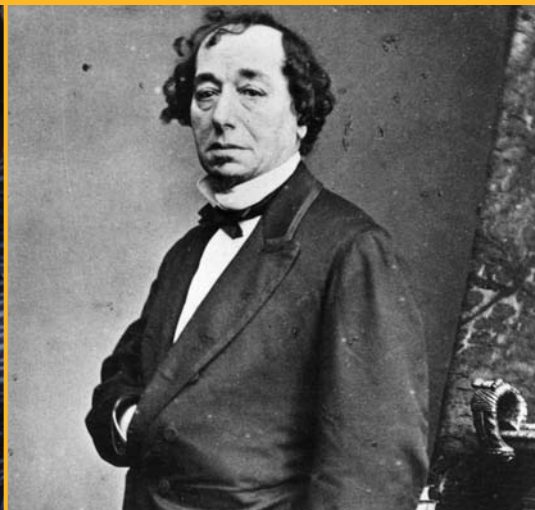

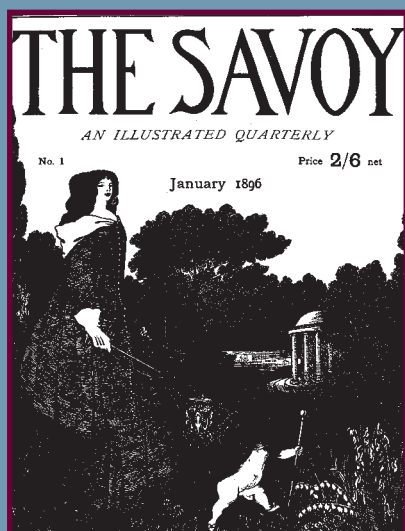

The premier index for scholarly journals in the arts, humanities and social sciences

Periodicals Index Online is a single index offering comprehensive coverage across thousands of journals in the humanities and social sciences. It is used in libraries around the world and relied on by thousands of scholars for their research.

It provides access to the contents pages for every issue of over 6,000 journals from their inception to 1995, and includes separate records for more than 18 million journal articles, across 37 subject areas and 59 languages and dialects.

More than simply a collection of static citations, *Periodicals Index Online* is the ideal starting point for research. It allows users to not only unlock a library's extensive holdings but also offers a range of seamless linking options to the library's electronic and print holdings, including:

- OpenURL compatible link resolvers – all citations records in *Periodicals Index Online* are capable of submitting metadata in OpenURL format to a library's link resolver database, where it can be checked against other resources that the library may have (including catalogue records for hardcopy holdings).
- *Periodicals Archive Online* – users with both the Index and Archive can link directly from citations in the Index to the full text in its sister database.
- JSTOR – embedded, direct links also take JSTOR subscribers straight to their article of choice from within *Periodicals Index Online*.

A growing online archive of digitised, full-image journal articles

Periodicals Archive Online builds on the indexing of its sister database, *Periodicals Index Online*, to offer users access to the complete back files of a growing body of journals from a wide range of publishers, all the way back to Volume 1, Issue 1. This content spans almost two centuries of research and criticism to provide a major resource for academic libraries. Users can search through millions of articles to immediately find the full text of important criticism and scholarship, relevant to their research.

The *Archive* programme continues to digitise and preserve additional content in the form of major interdisciplinary collections. At present there are six complete collections and a seventh in production.

Key features include:

- Interdisciplinary collections covering 37 key subject areas across the arts, humanities and social sciences.
- International content, including more than 20 languages and dialects.
- Content spanning almost 200 years of leading scholarship.

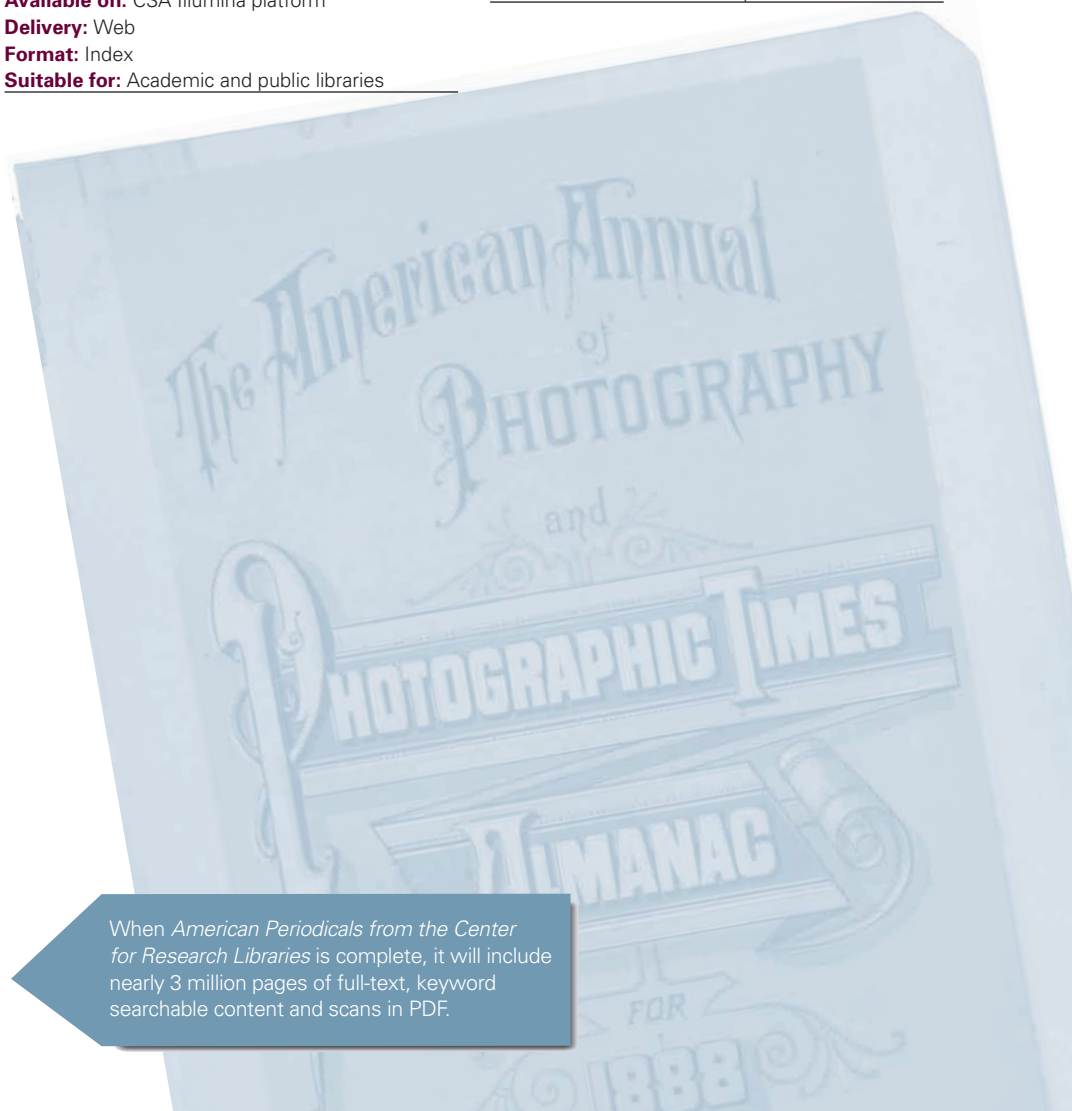
FRANCIS

A multilingual, multidisciplinary database covering the humanities and social sciences

FRANCIS contains more than 1 million records, with abstracts in French or English, and descriptors in both languages, and includes coverage of journals, books, conference papers, and other documents from many countries and in many languages.

The *FRANCIS* database has been created by the Institut de l'Information Scientifique et Technique of the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique (INIST-CNRS) in Vandoeuvre-les-Nancy, France.

British Periodicals

Full-text collections of hundreds of periodicals capturing the attitudes and preoccupations of a nation over 250 years

British Periodicals traces the development and growth of the periodical press in Britain from its origins in the 17th century through to the Victorian 'age of periodicals' and beyond, forming an unrivalled record of more than two centuries of British history, and providing unique insights into Britain's political, economic and social influence on the wider world.

In addition to providing access to landmark texts by major authors, this groundbreaking digital archive offers researchers exciting new ways of exploring the inaccessible, neglected or forgotten writings that formed their original contexts.

British Periodicals is available in two collections and has been painstakingly recreated in electronic form from UMI® Microfilm Collections.

British Periodicals Collection I consists of 160 journals that comprise the UMI microfilm collection *Early British Periodicals*, the equivalent of 5,238 printed volumes containing approximately 3.1 million pages. A wide array of different types of periodicals are represented, from magisterial quarterlies and scholarly professional organs through to coterie art periodicals, penny weeklies and illustrated family magazines. Topics covered include literature, philosophy, history, science, the fine arts, and the social sciences.

British Periodicals Collection II consists of more than 300 journals from the UMI microfilm collections *English Literary Periodicals* and *British Periodicals in the Creative Arts* together with additional titles, amounting to almost 3 million pages. Topics covered include literature, music, art, drama, archaeology, and architecture.

British Periodicals Collection I and *British Periodicals Collection II* together provide the full text of all the titles covered by *The Wellesley Index to Victorian Periodicals*.

The Wellesley Index to Victorian Periodicals is a unique index to the authorship of articles within 45 major Victorian periodicals. Bibliographies are available for each contributor and for all pseudonyms used, providing unique access to the vast majority of articles published in Victorian periodicals which were anonymous or pseudonymous.

This online version of *The Wellesley Index* provides seamless linking between article records, contributor and pseudonym records, and periodical introductions, and includes links to article full text for selected titles in *Periodicals Archive Online* and *British Periodicals* for users with the appropriate subscriptions. It also incorporates the *Curran Index* of corrections and additions to Wellesley.

A new organising force for research on the 19th century, *C19: The Nineteenth Century Index* provides integrated access to a vast collection of research material. This one-stop finding tool covers many content types, with title-level records for books and government documents, article-level records for periodicals and newspapers, and collection-level records for archives. Users can search across all databases, or conduct more specific research through collection-specific search screens. Links to full-text materials are available to customers of component collections.

Now containing over 20 million records, *C19: The Nineteenth Century Index* includes a number of unique and important indexes:

- Books – the *Nineteenth-Century Short Title Catalogue* (NSTC) and *The Nineteenth Century* microfiche project from the British Library.
