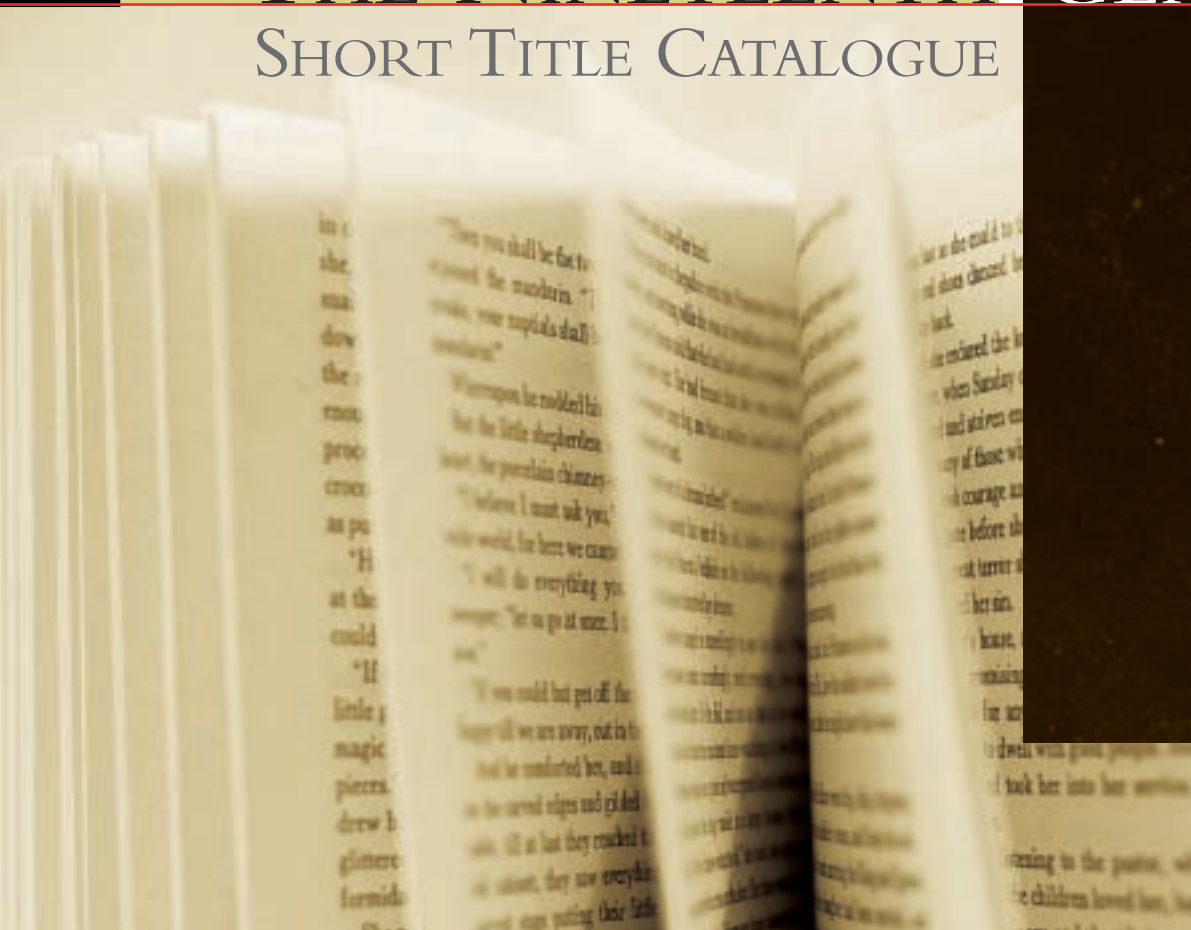




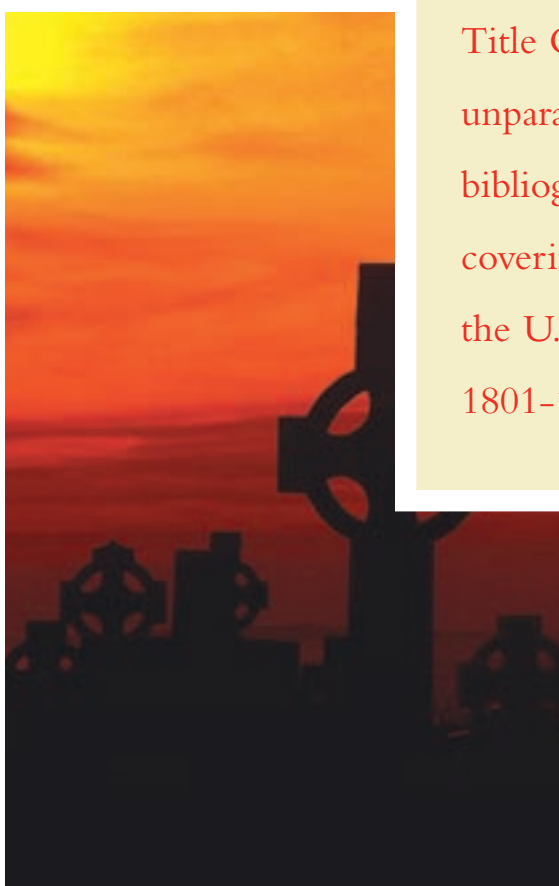

NSTC offers bibliographic access to the age of groundbreaking literature (Dickens, Twain, James); philosophy (Thoreau, Mill, Emerson); science (Darwin, *Nature*, *Scientific American*); and more. NSTC records not only works in English but in Celtic, Gaelic, French, Welsh, and various languages from the British Empire, as well as texts translated for use by missionaries into rare and even extinct languages. ■ All relevant materials in the Bodleian Library, The British Library, Cambridge, University Library, Trinity College (Dublin), National Library of Scotland, and Newcastle University Library are recorded in NSTC, plus Library of Congress and Harvard University Library holdings from 1816 to 1919. ■ Bibliographic records include author statements, imprint (including date, place, notes, and multiple editions), library location, and subject terms and classification numbers.

■ With NSTC, researchers can:

- Compile an authoritative bibliography
- Identify seminal works from a specific field
- Trace the use of words and phrases
- Explore the life of a historical figure

Simple Yet Sophisticated Searching

A number of search capabilities allow users, from beginners to advanced searchers, to quickly find the information they want. Users can develop complete research bibliographies by performing a single search. The search provides the most complete set of records available in one consistent format, saving the time needed to consult multiple sources from different databases in different formats.

■ Users can search by:

- Keyword
- Subject
- Author
- Lifespan
- Title
- Publication date
- Publication place
- Publisher
- Language
- Location
- Series ID
- Entry number

These search terms can be joined with “and” or “or,” and users can browse the search terms for all of the key fields. There is field-specific help. ■ In addition, users can search across multiple fields, re-sort results and hyperlink between

authors and subjects, mark and save records and searches to a personal archive, or for printing and emailing. ■ The search capabilities in NSTC allow researchers to narrow and pinpoint a search to find specific items such as:

- Titles of novels published in New York during a given time period
- Records relating to the Boer War
- All of Louisa May Alcott’s writings
- All items that reference a specific word
- All titles published in the U.S. written in German during a specific time span
